The Board discussed possibilities regarding next steps for the Highland Heights property. The Board also discussed the three-acre lot located near Pleasant View. Due to the cost of upkeep, the Board determined to bring a recommendation to move forward with the appraisal and ultimately the sale of the building and property. The Board also determined to send a letter to the party who previously expressed interest in the building to inform them of the intent to sell.

Transportation Policies Work Session
