

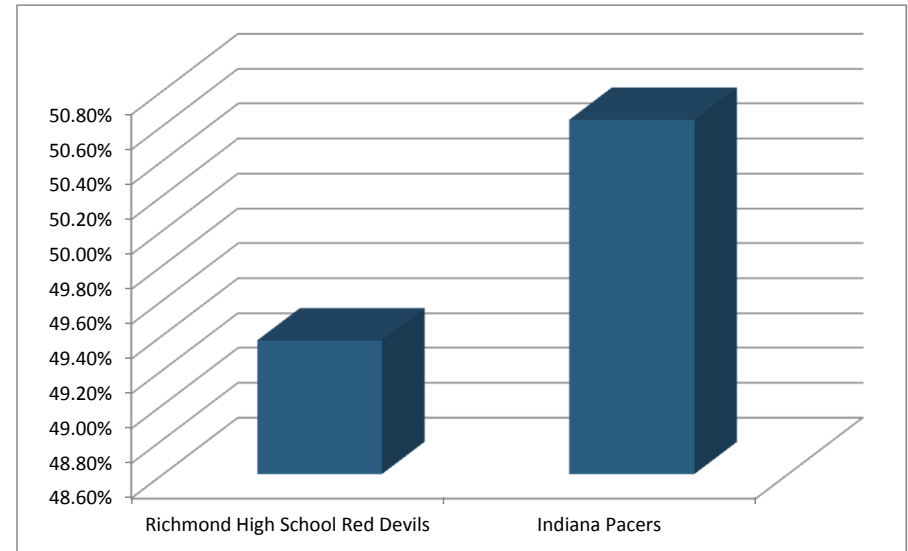

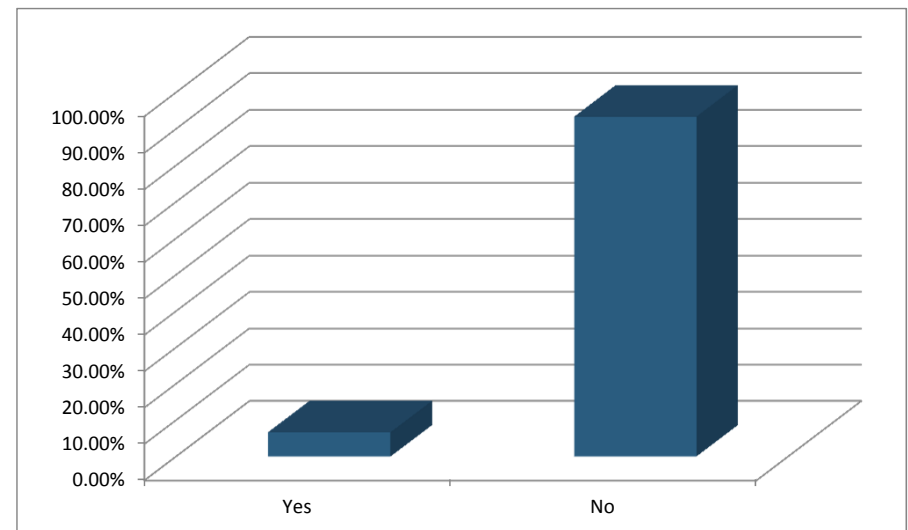
1. Who is going to have the better basketball season record? (Multiple Choice)

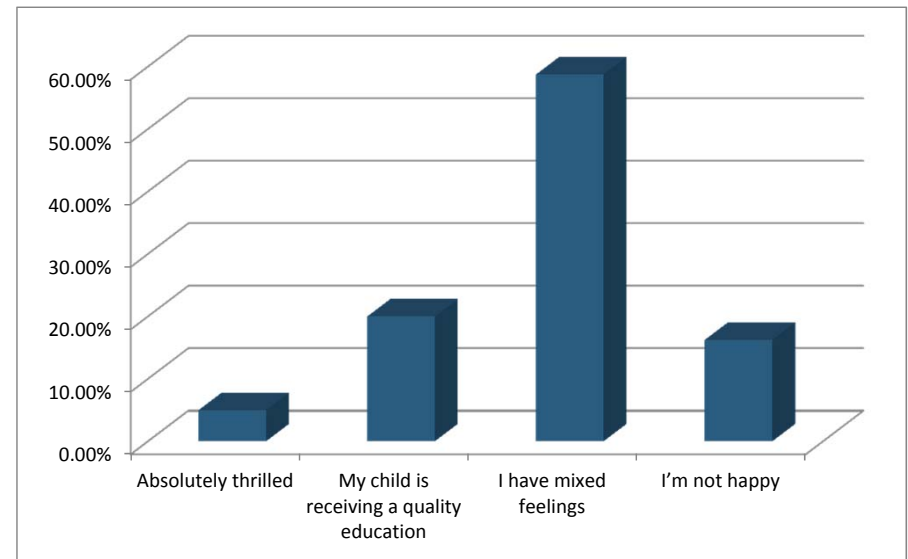

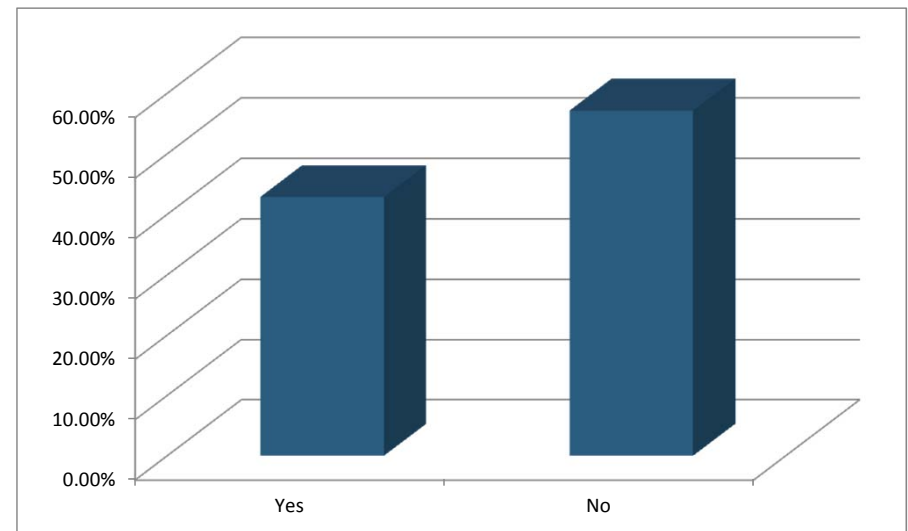

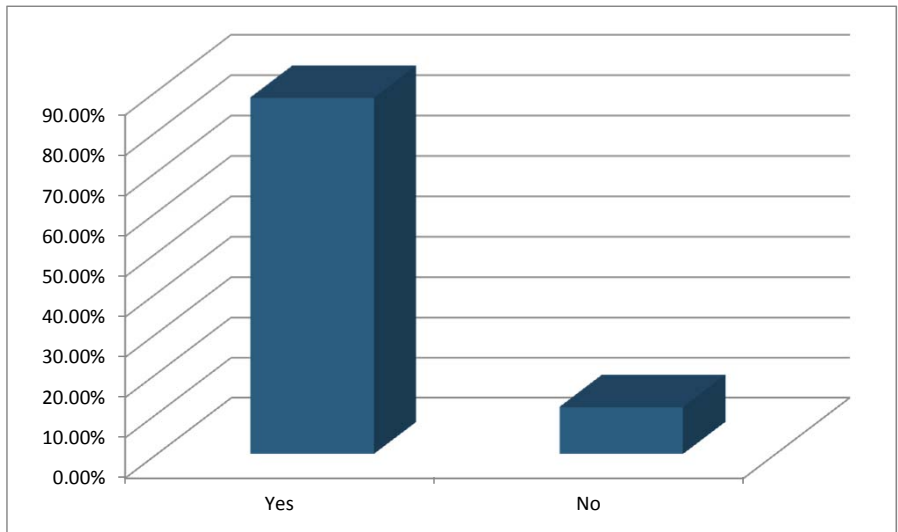

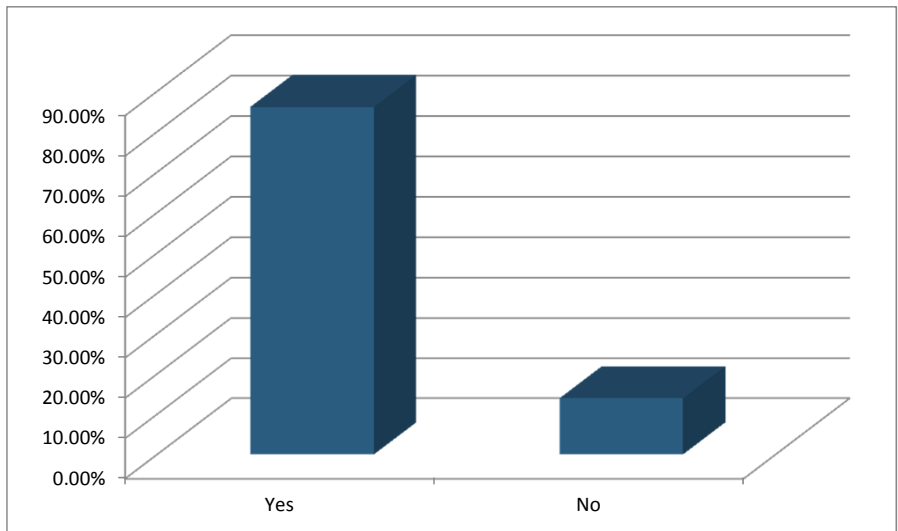
5. Within the last three years, have you visited or toured Richmond High School? (Multiple Choice)

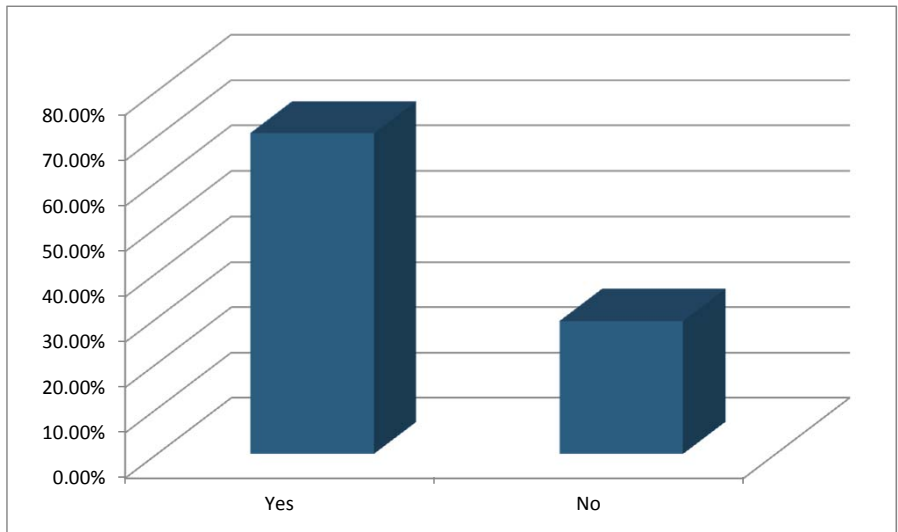
6. Within the last three years, have you recently visited or toured Dennis, Hibberd or Test Schools? (Multiple Choice)

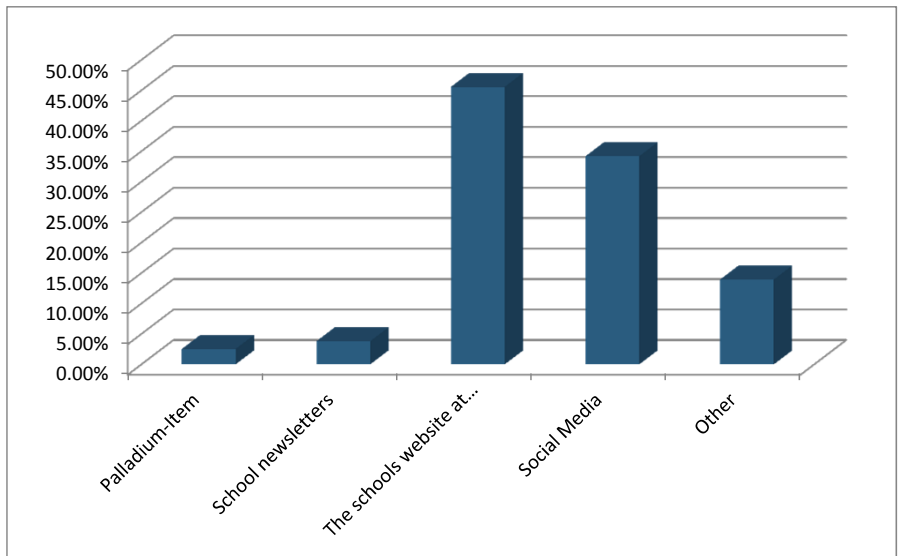
7. Within the last three years, have you recently visited or toured any of the elementary schools? (Multiple Choice)

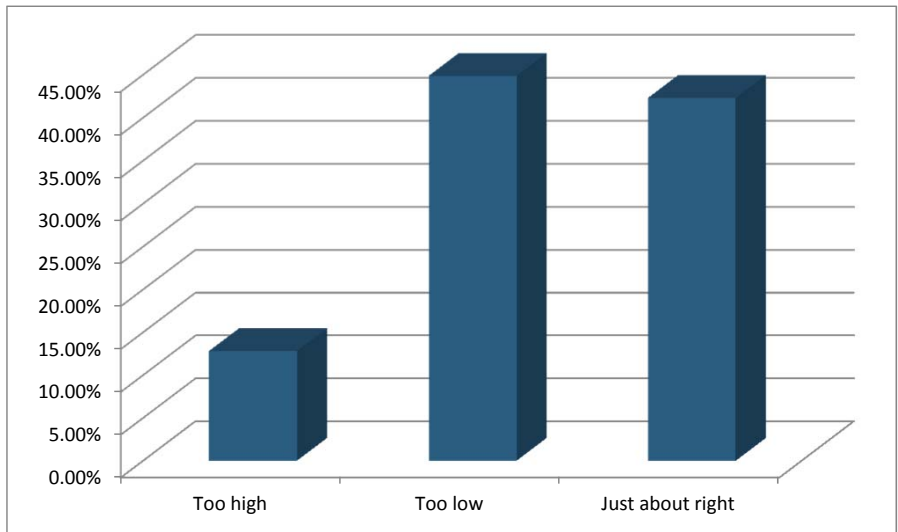

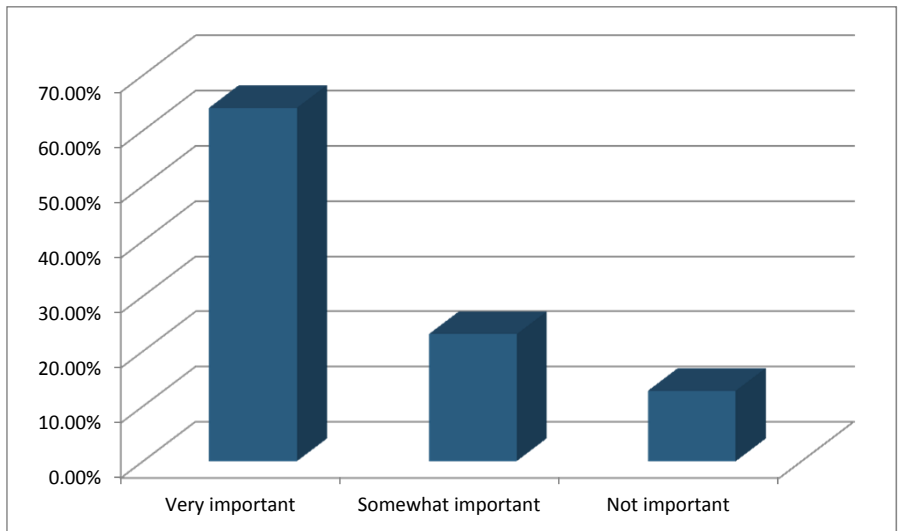
9. From your observations, do you find the enrollment growth projections for Richmond Community Schools to be: (Multiple Choice)

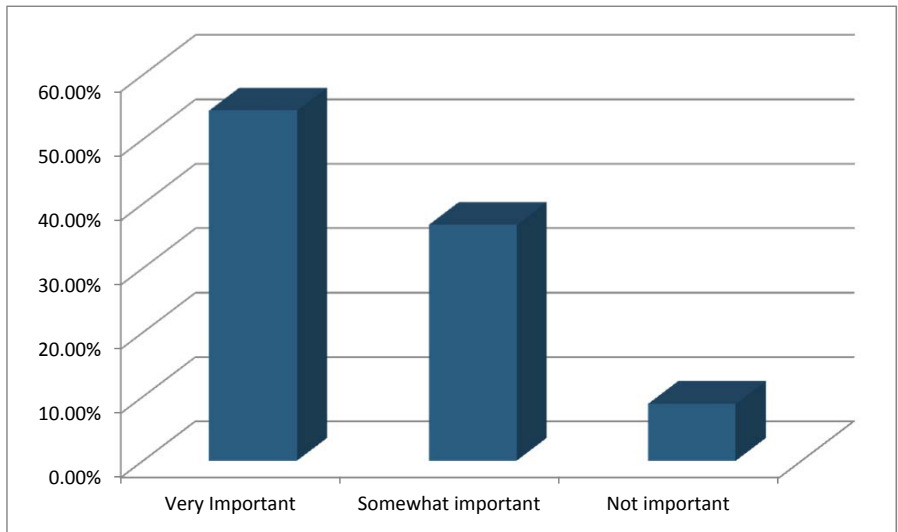
10. How important is the quality of education provided by Richmond Community Schools to the overall quality of life in Richmond? (Multiple Choice)

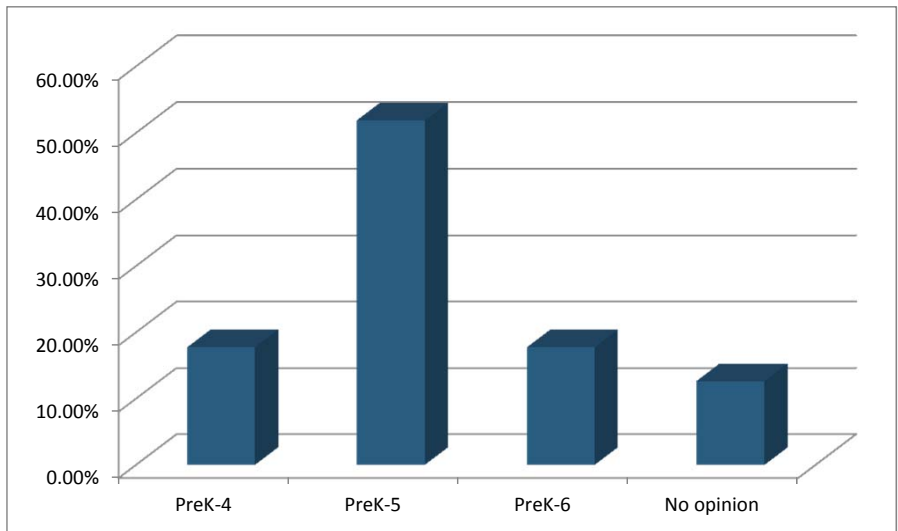

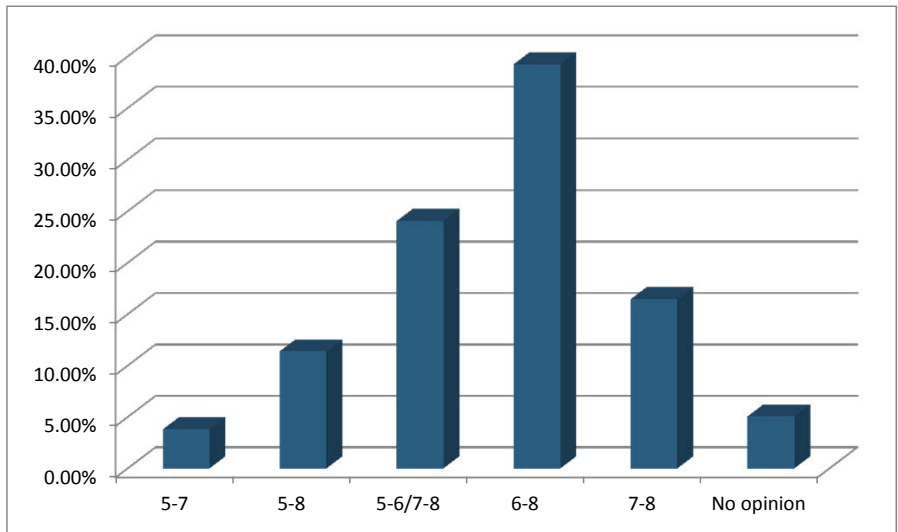
12. In your opinion, what is the best grade configuration for an elementary school? (Multiple Choice)

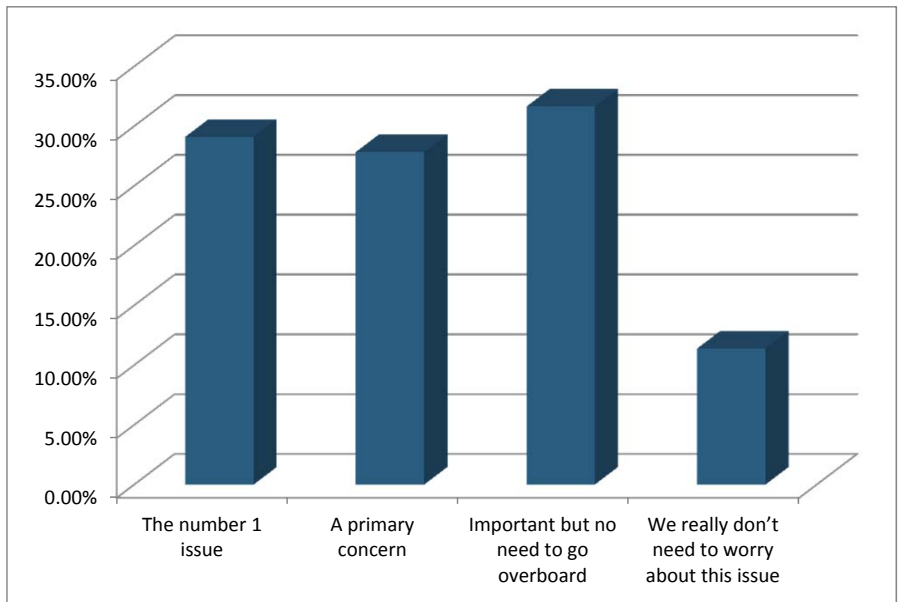

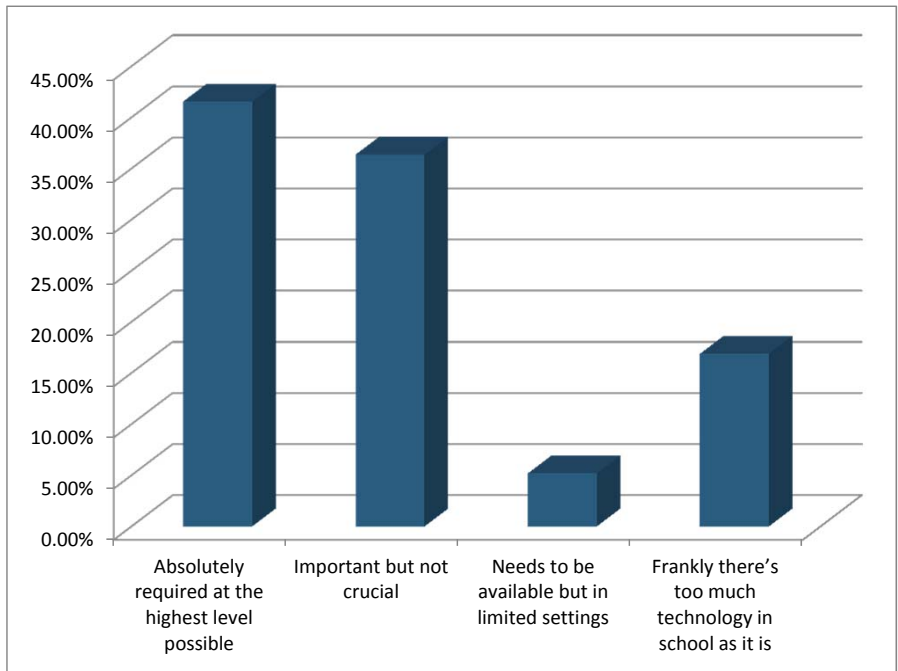

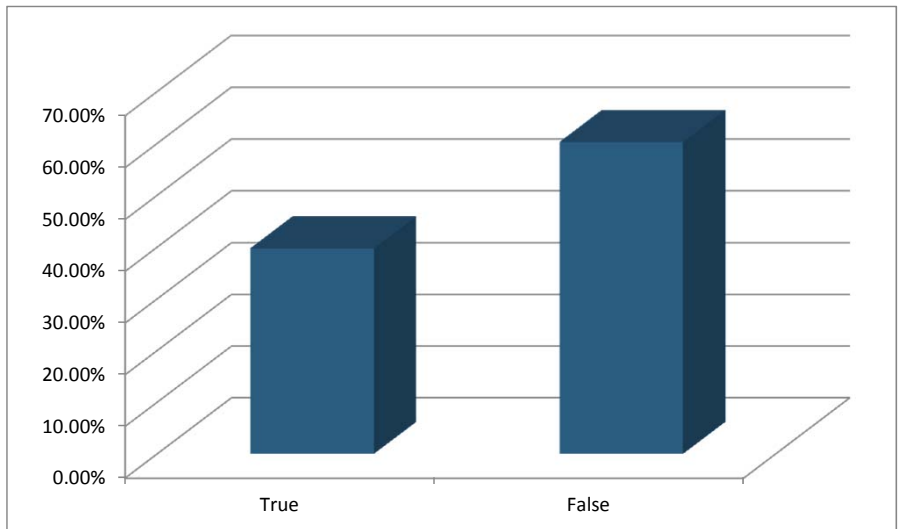

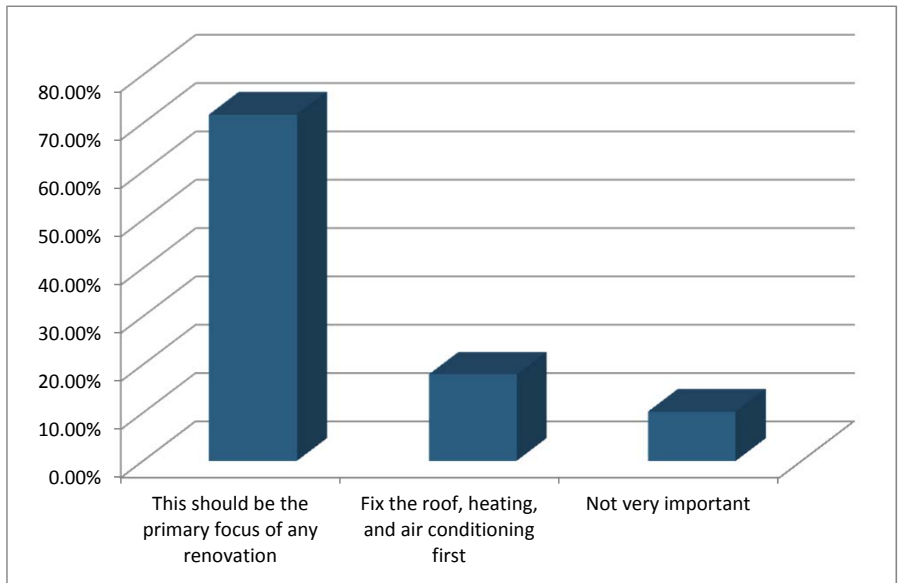

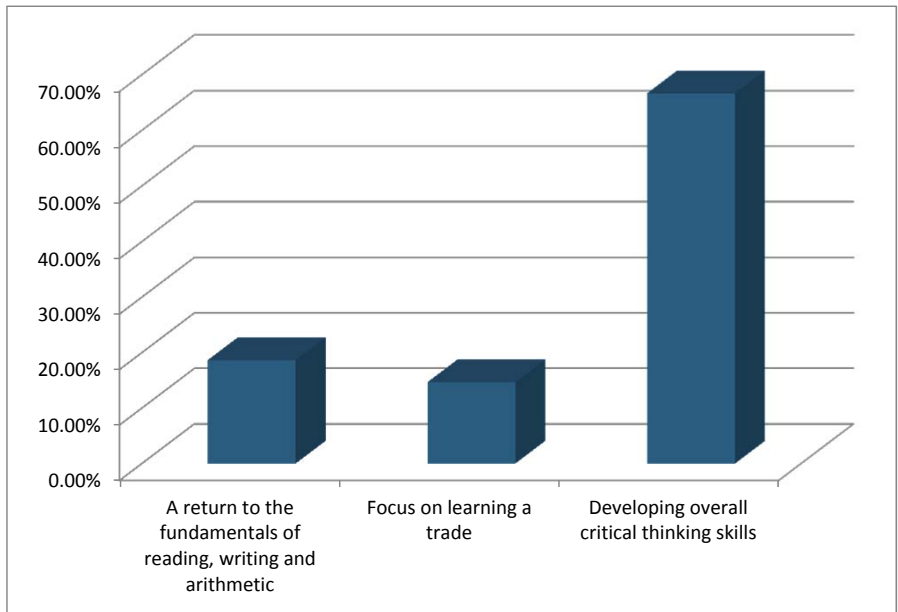

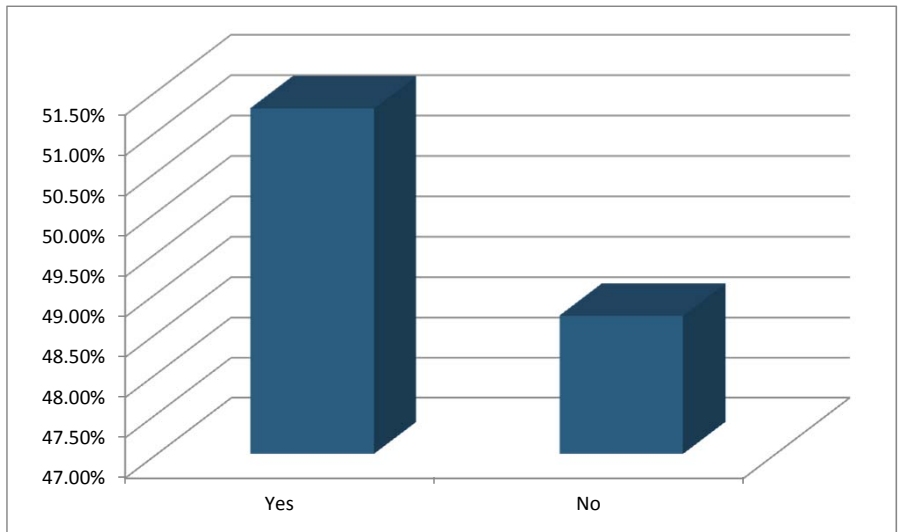
