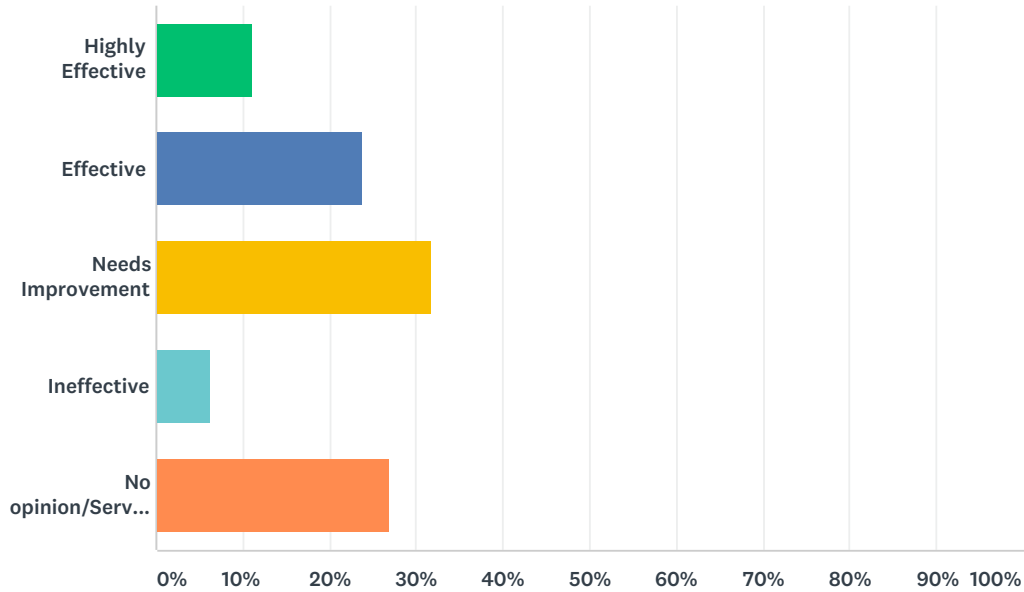


Q1 Our Special Education continuum of services is an array of services that include inclusion, pullout, and self-contained classes. Do you believe our Special Education services are?

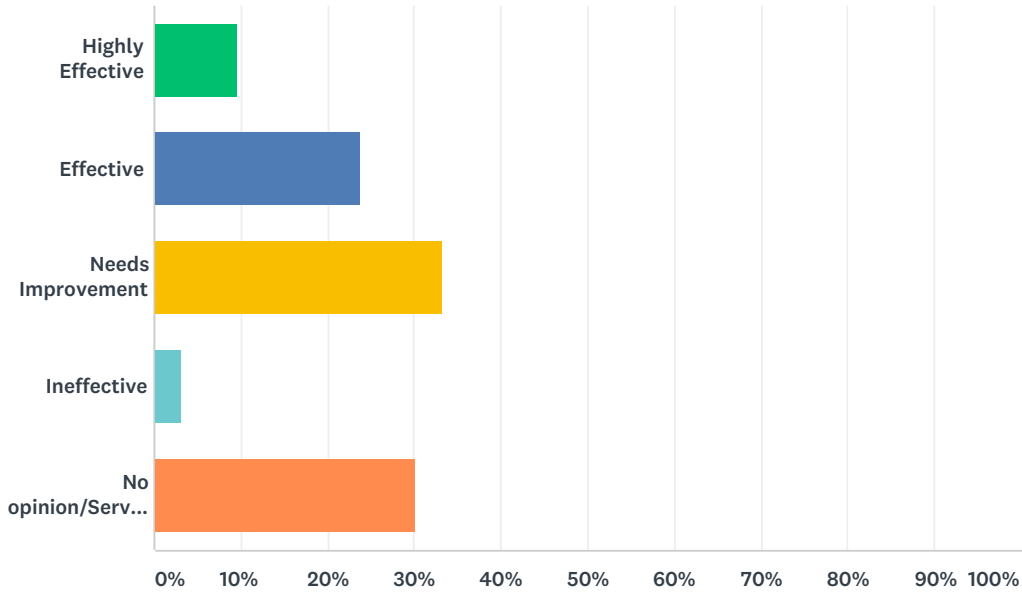

Q2 English Learners are offered a number of services including direct (in class, pullout) and indirect services (consultation). Do you believe our English Learners services are?

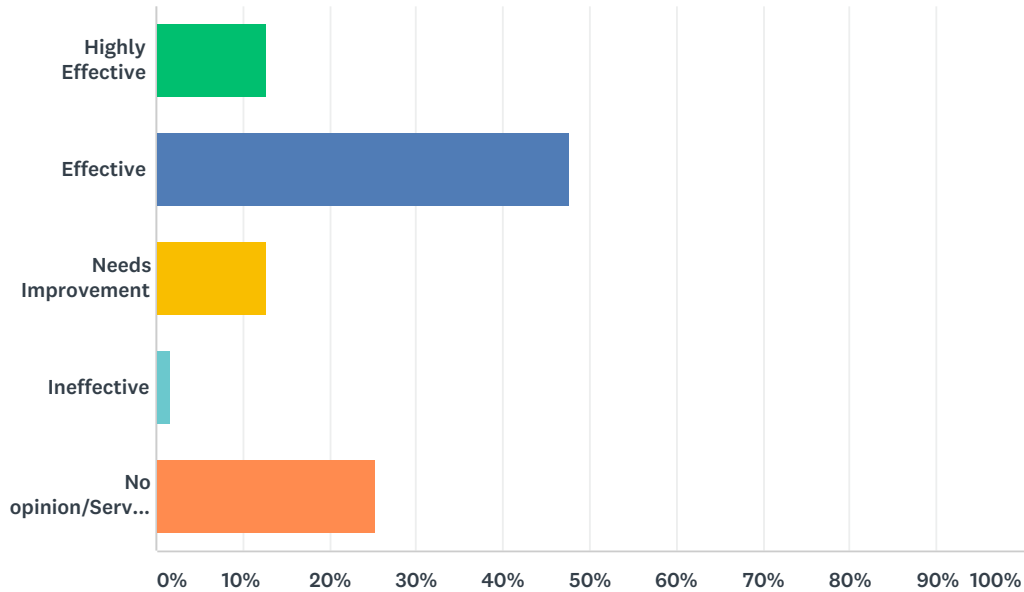

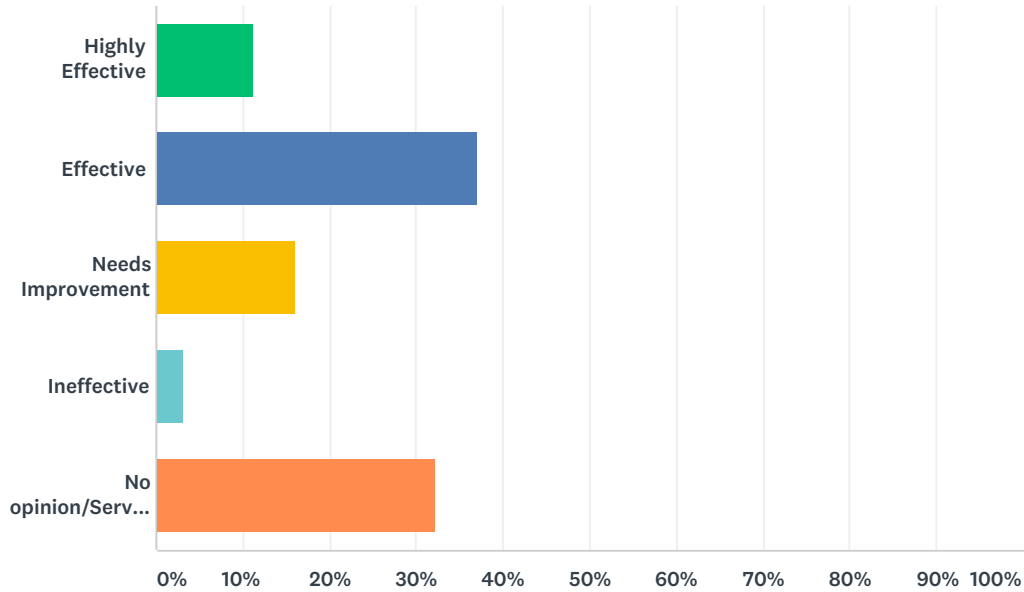

Q4 Our In-house Alternative Education Program provides a hybrid teacher lead and online classroom setting during the school day. Do you believe our Alternative Education Program is?

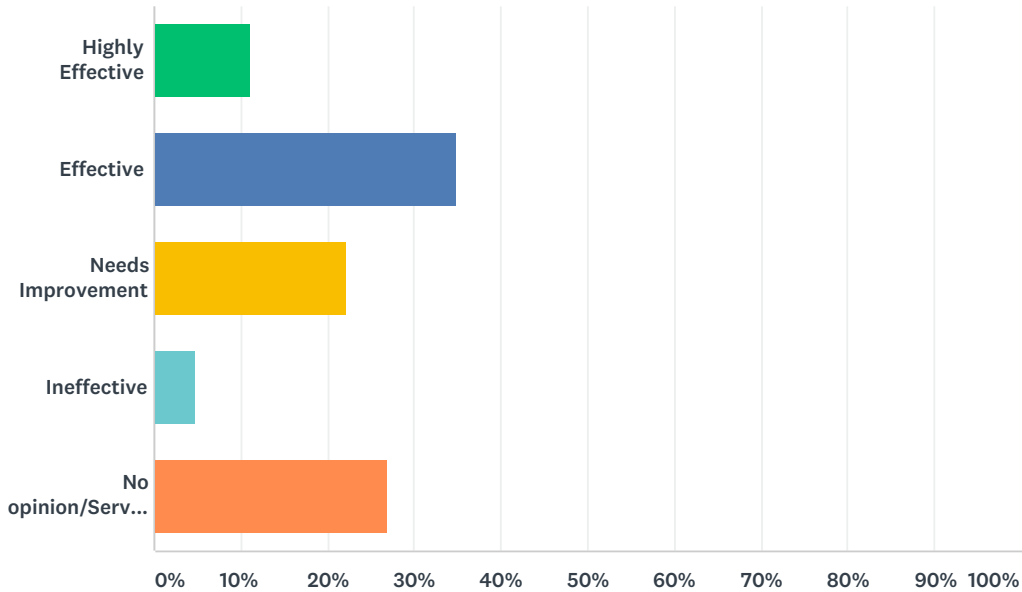

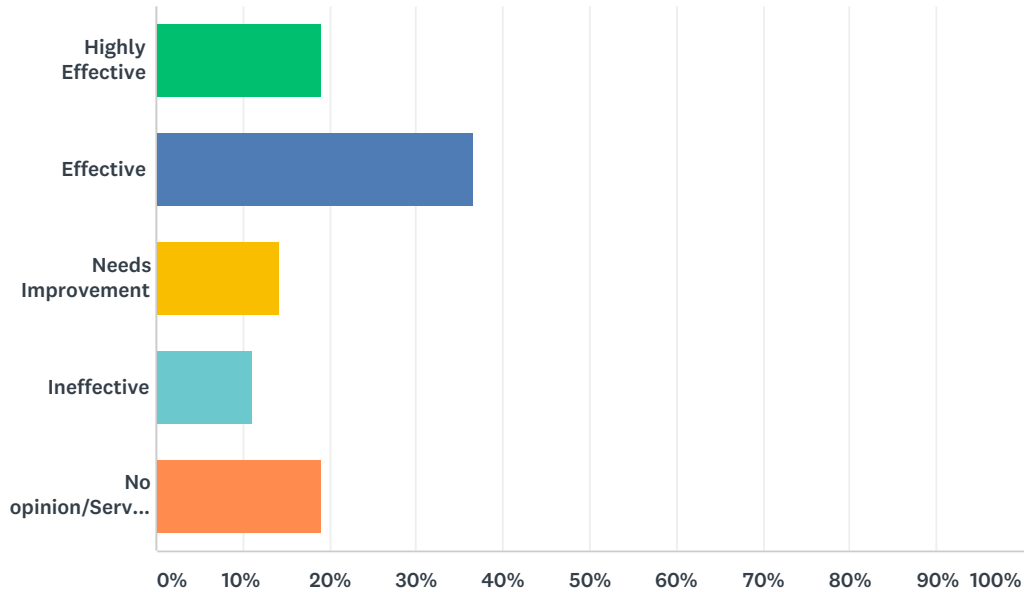

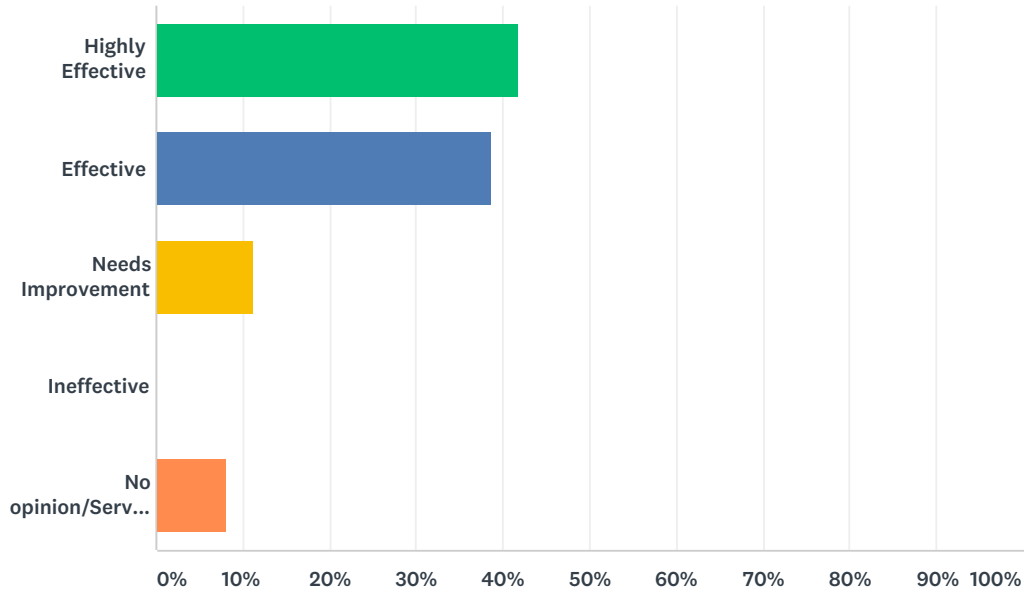

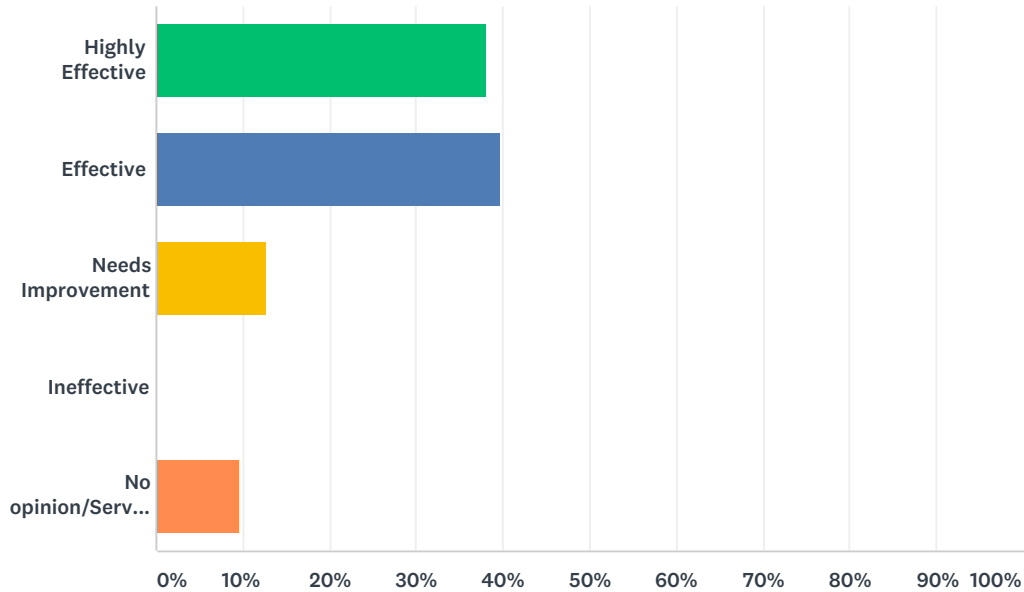

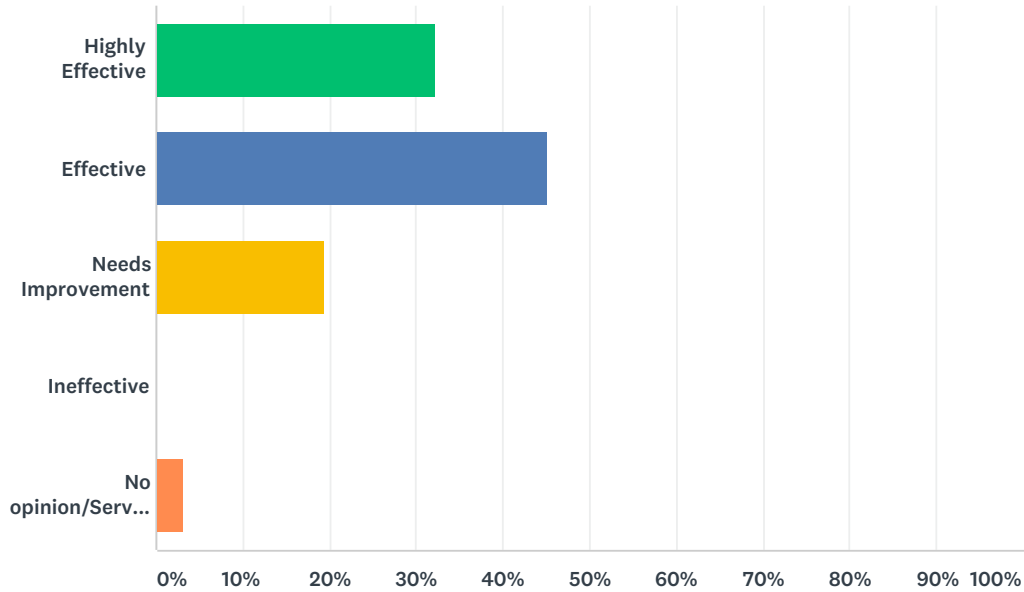

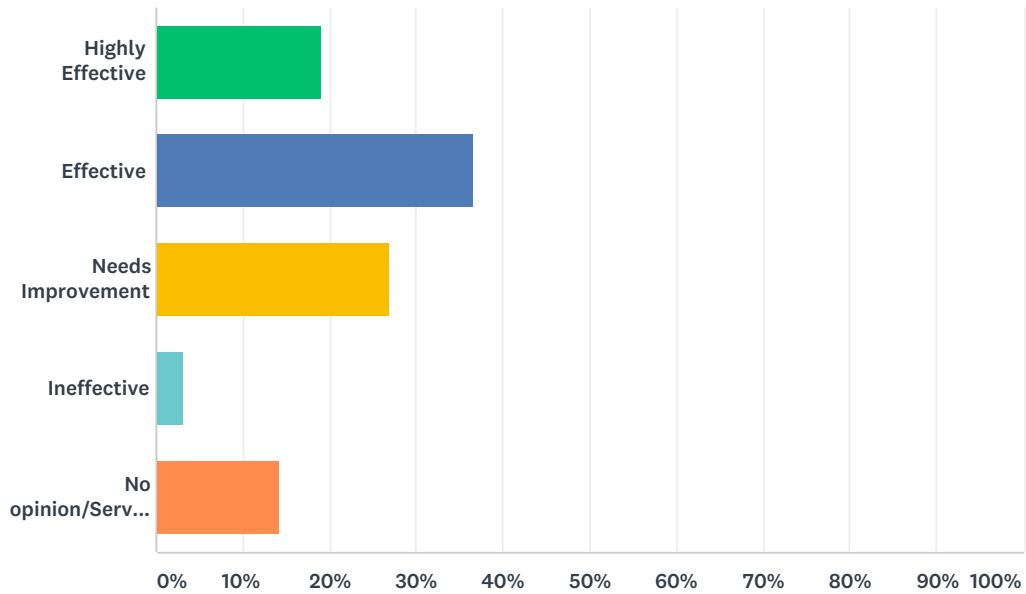

Q10 Our Community in Schools works with students and parents to connect families with community resources. Do you believe our Community in Schools Program is?

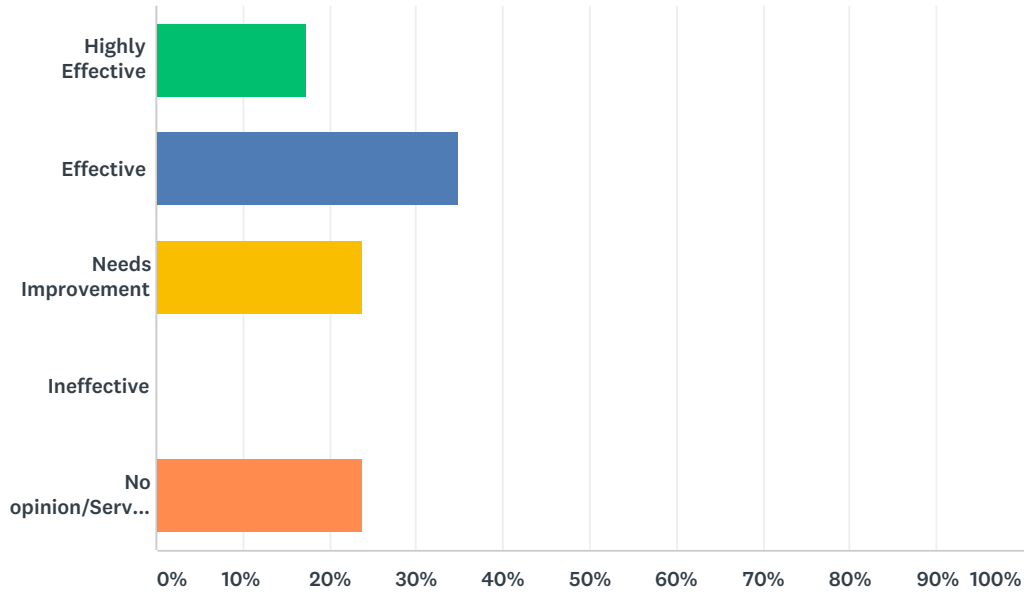

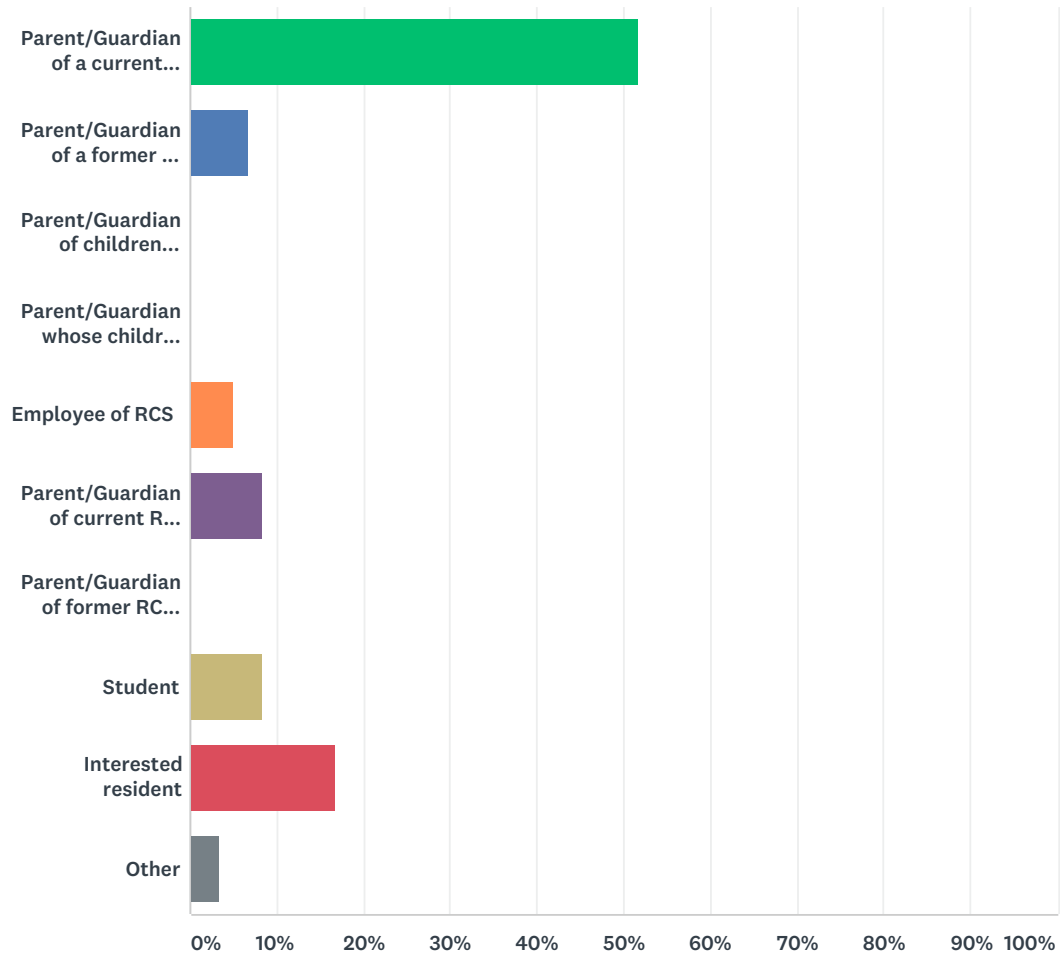

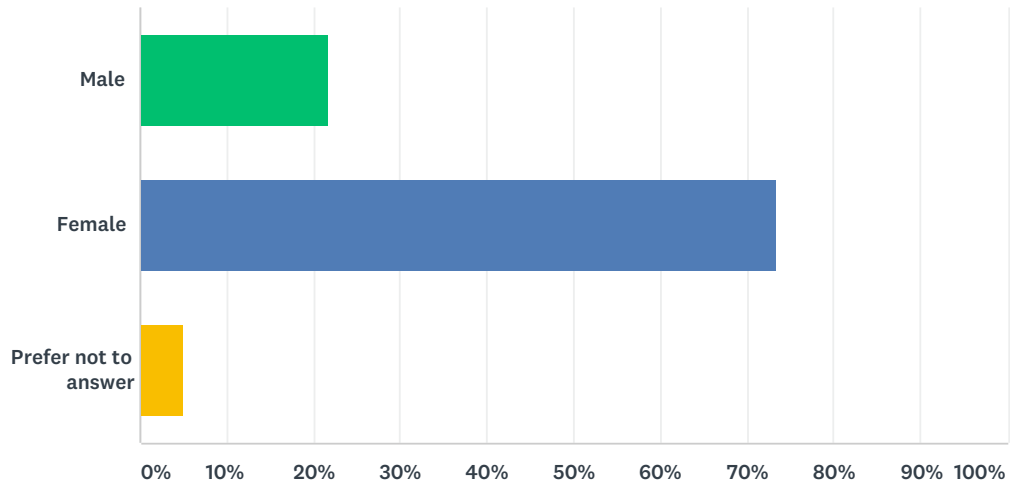

Q17 What is your gender?

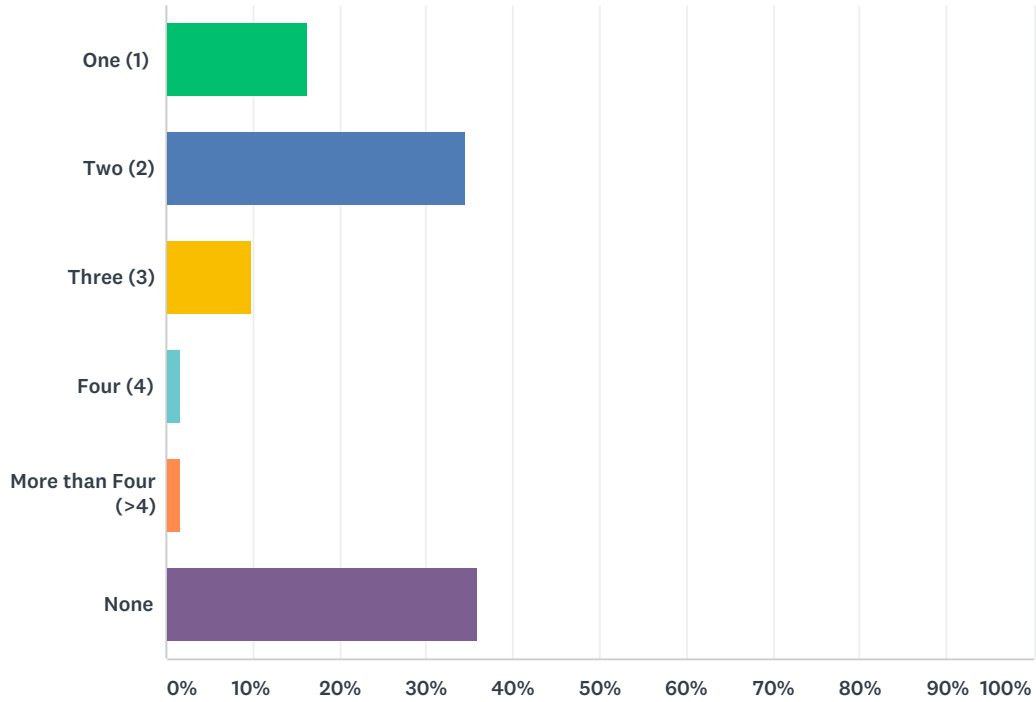

Q18 How many children ages 5 to 18 do you have?

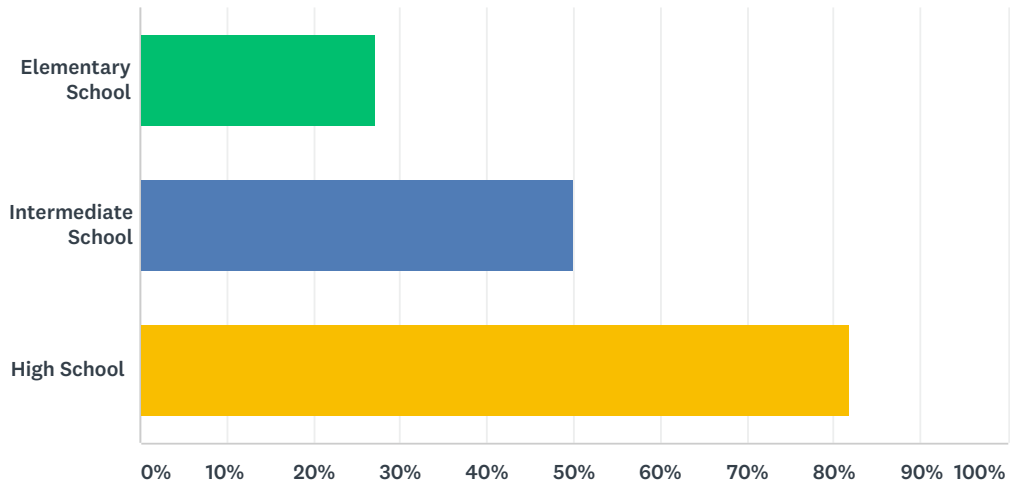
