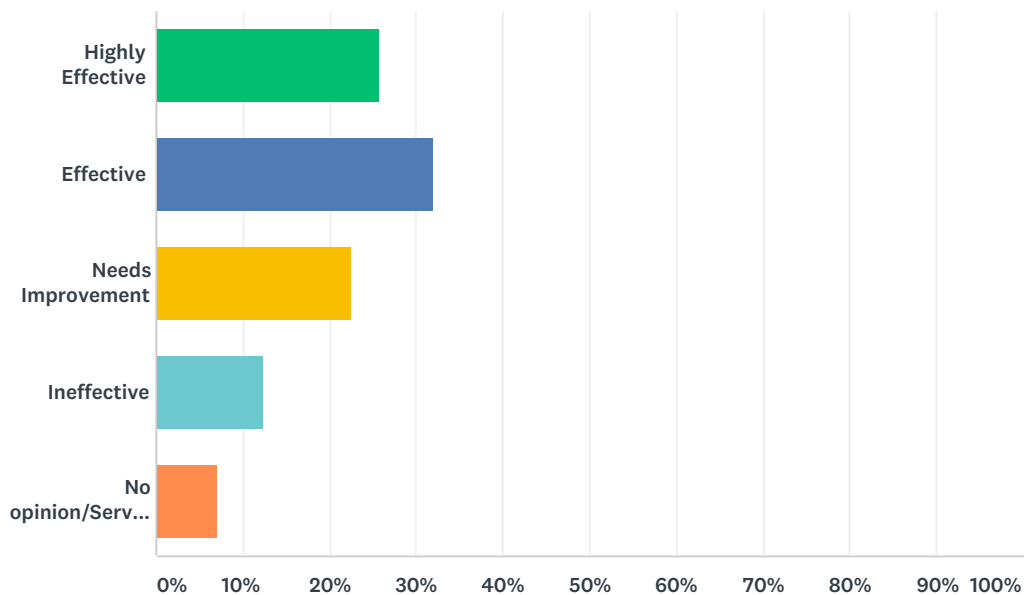

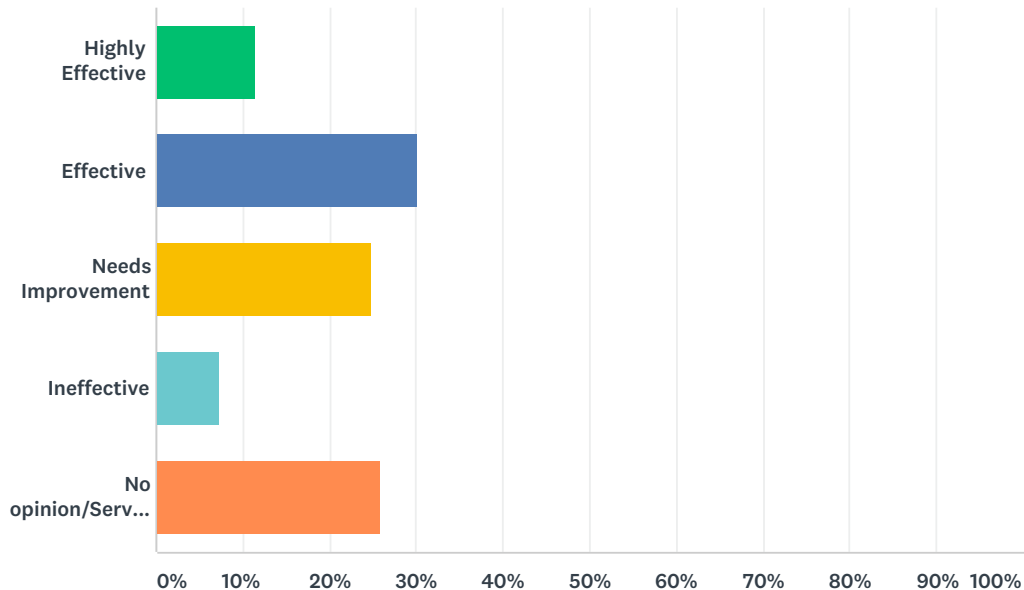

Q2 Our Special Education continuum of services is an array of services that include inclusion, pullout, and self-contained classes. Do you believe our Special Education Services are?

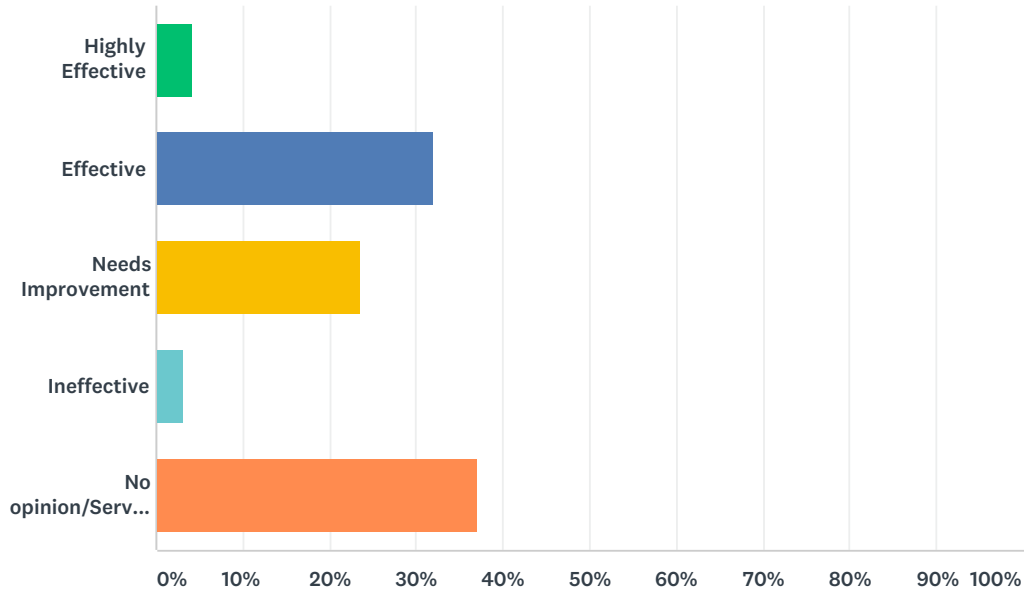

Q3 English Learners are offered a number of services including direct (in class, pullout) and indirect services (consultation) Do you believe our English Learners Services are?

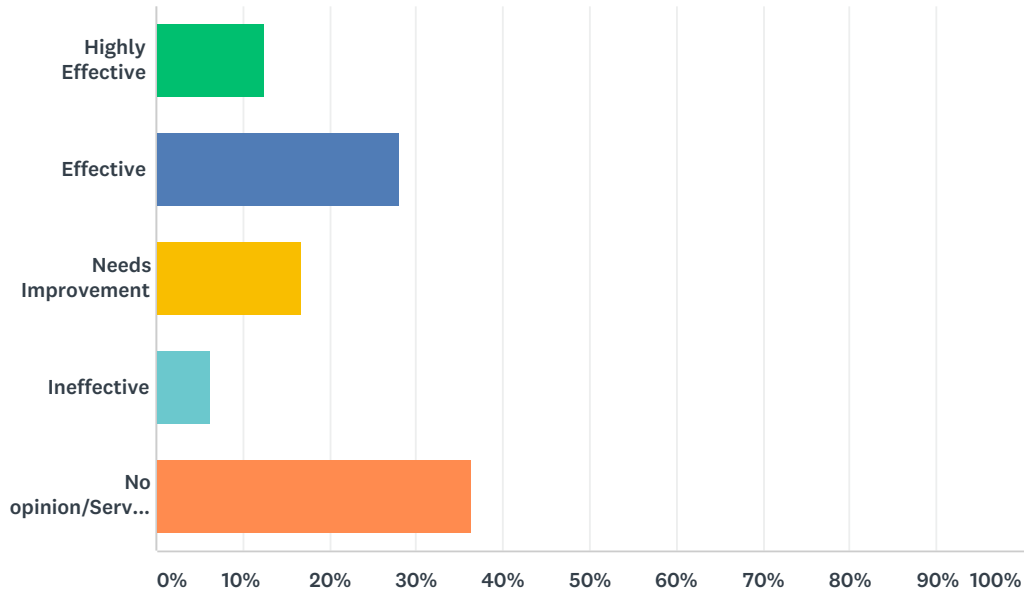

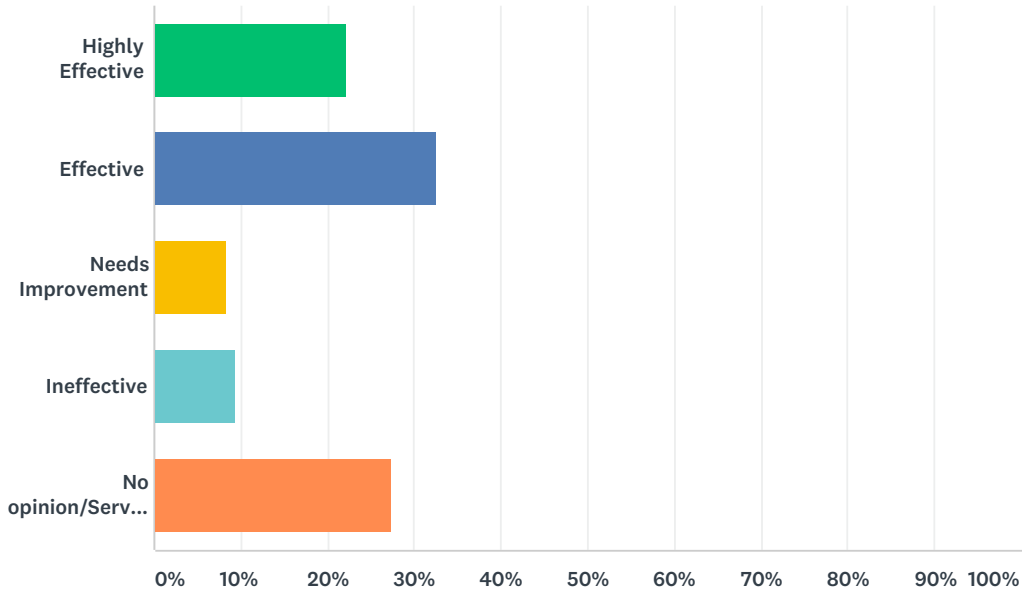

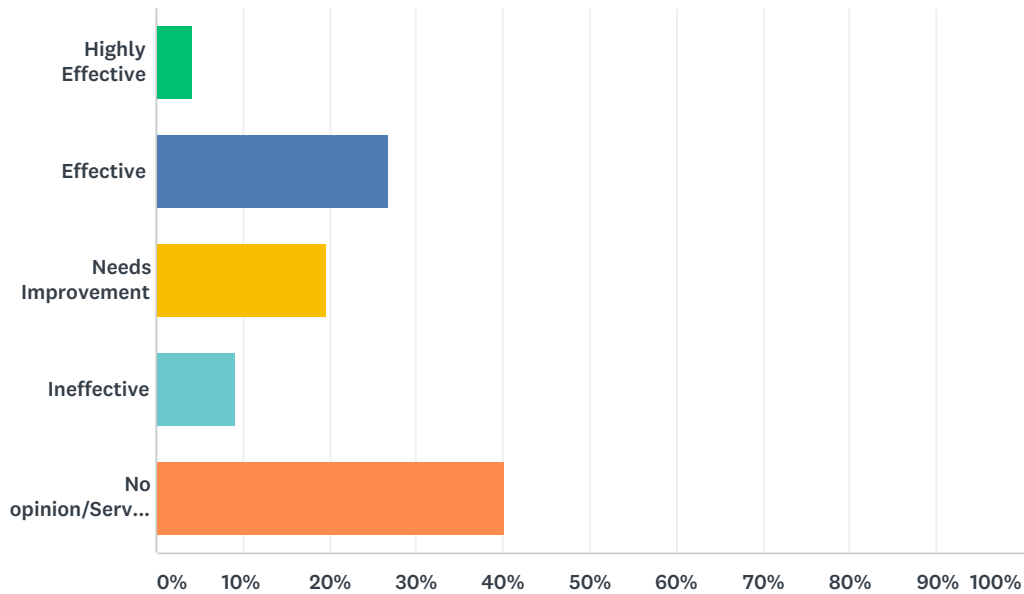

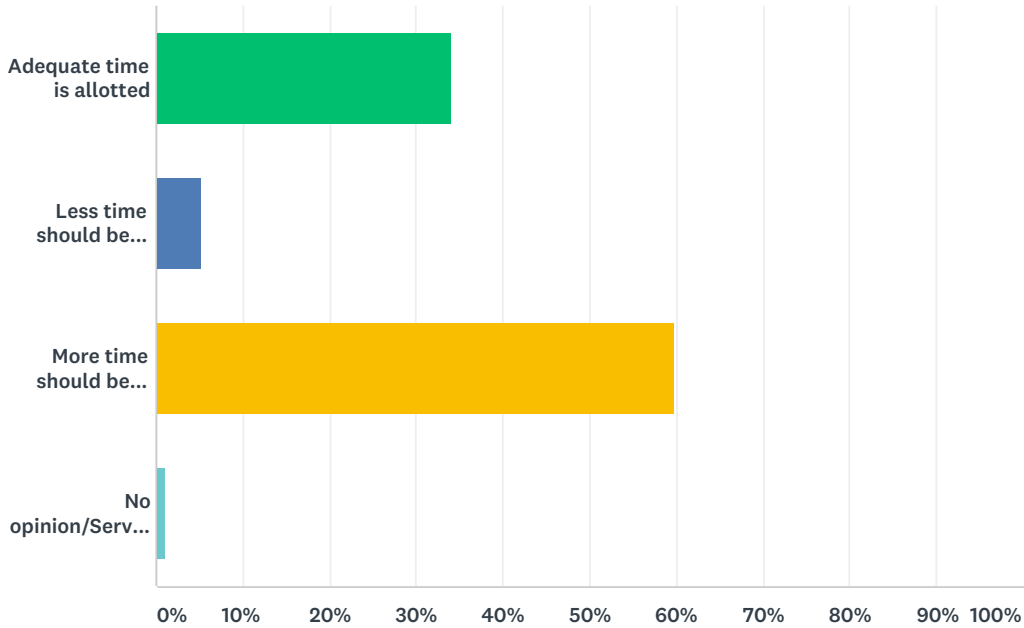

Q7 Physical Education offerings include health and/or physical education classes in each grade. What do you believe about the amount of time allotted for Physical Education offerings?

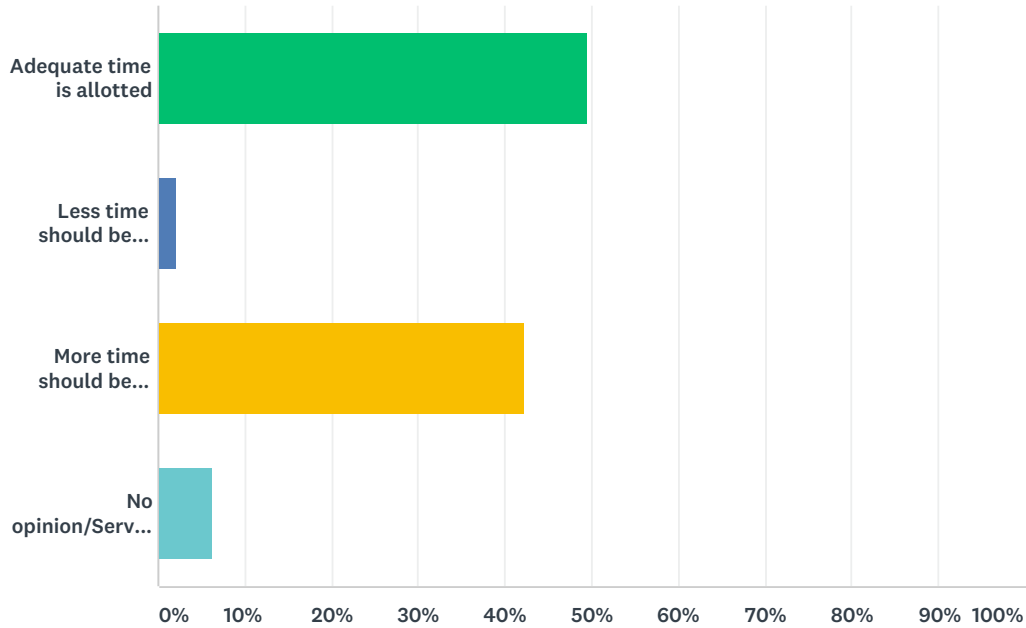

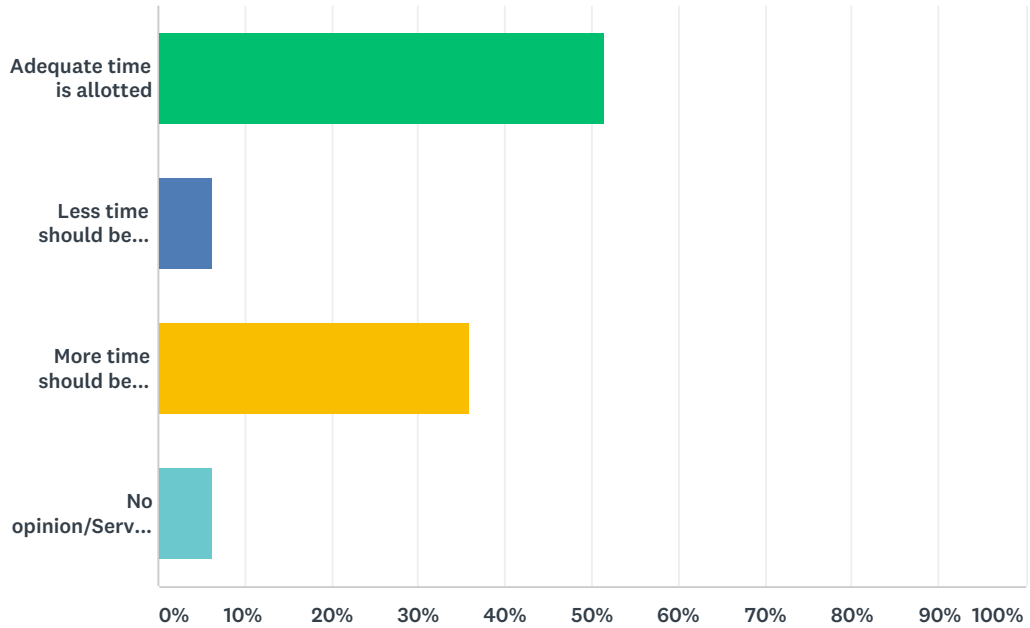

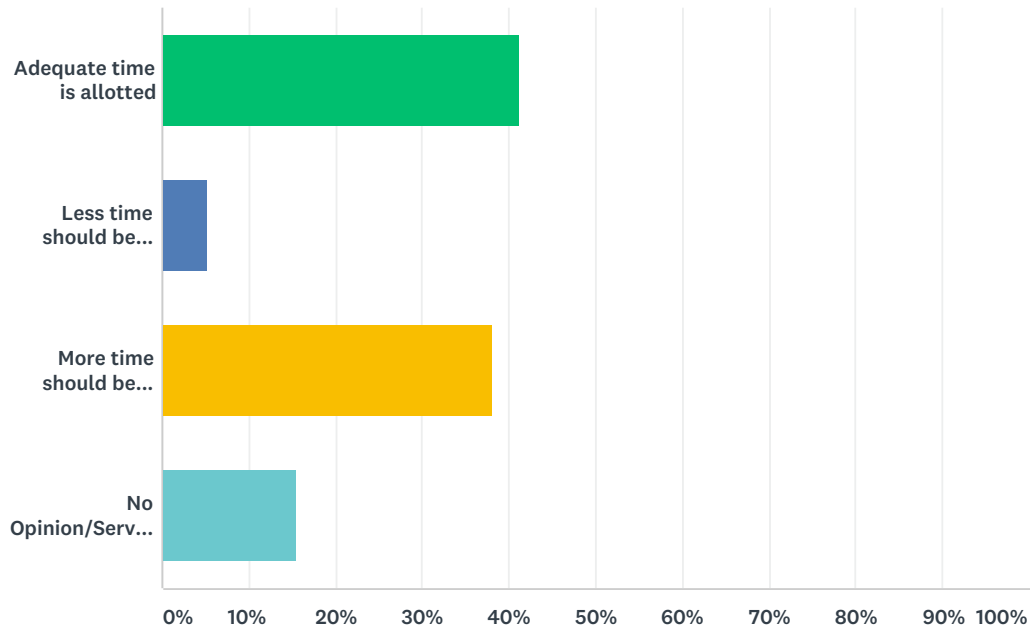

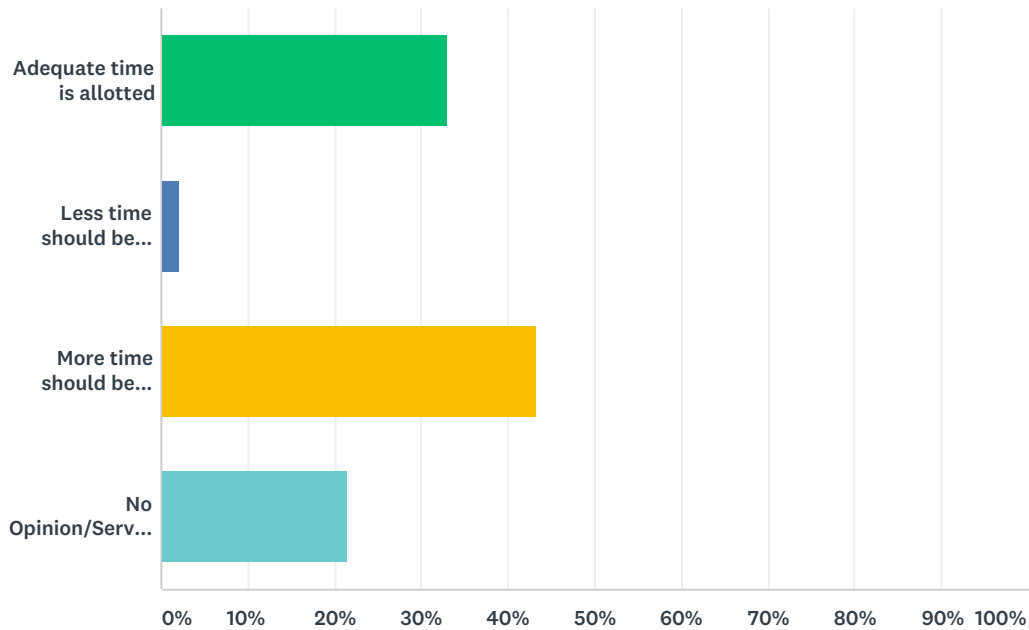

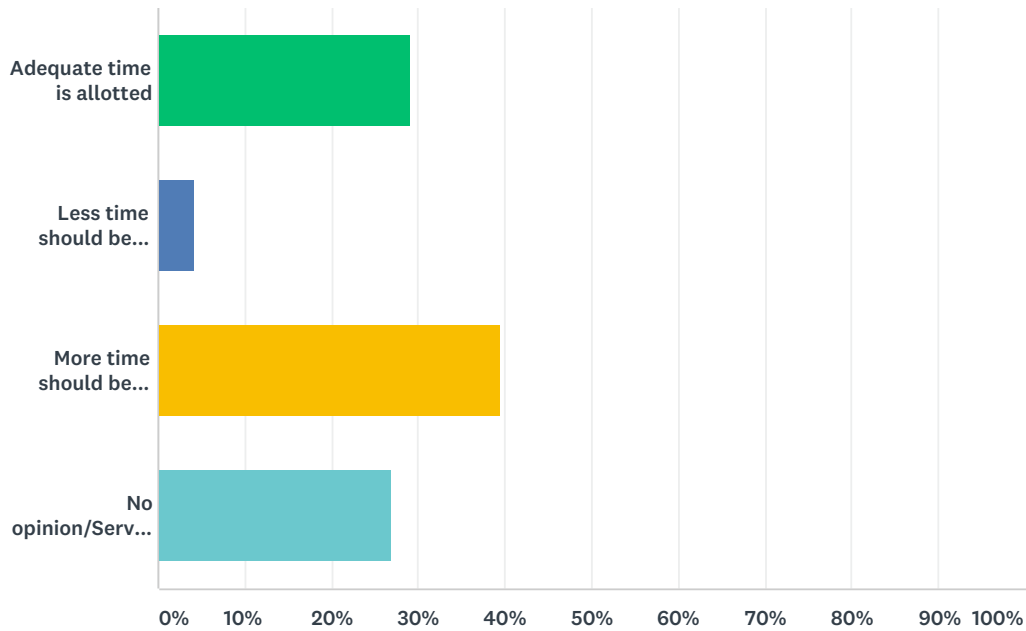

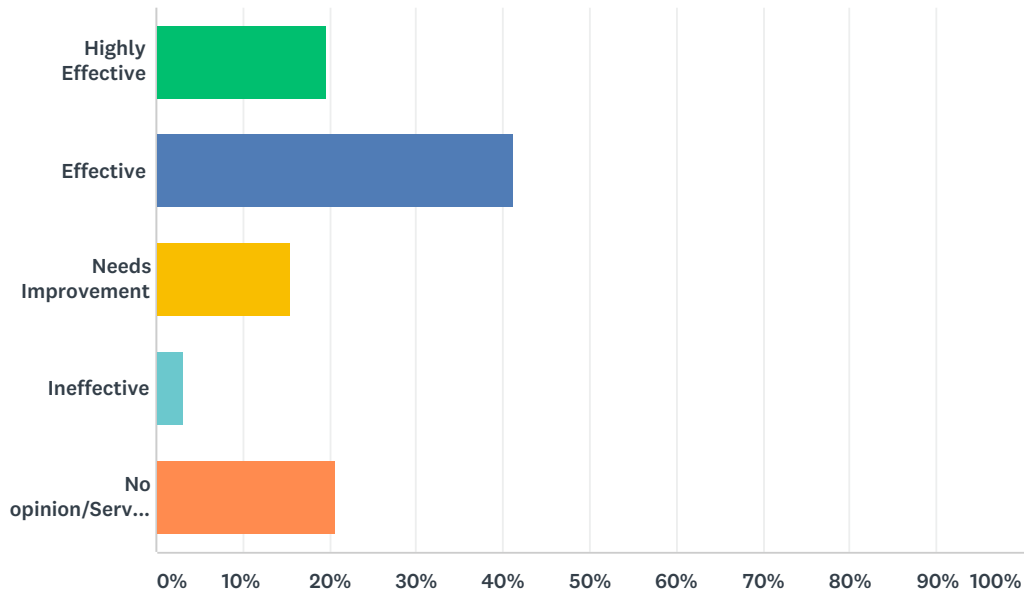

Q13 Our Community in Schools works with students and parents to connect families with community resources. Do you believe our Community in Schools Program is?

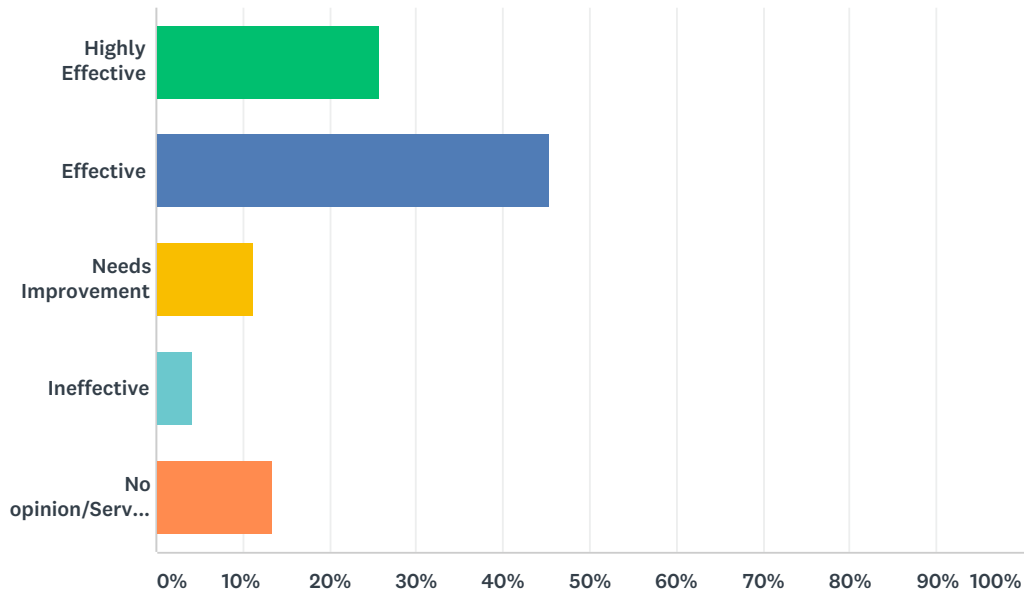

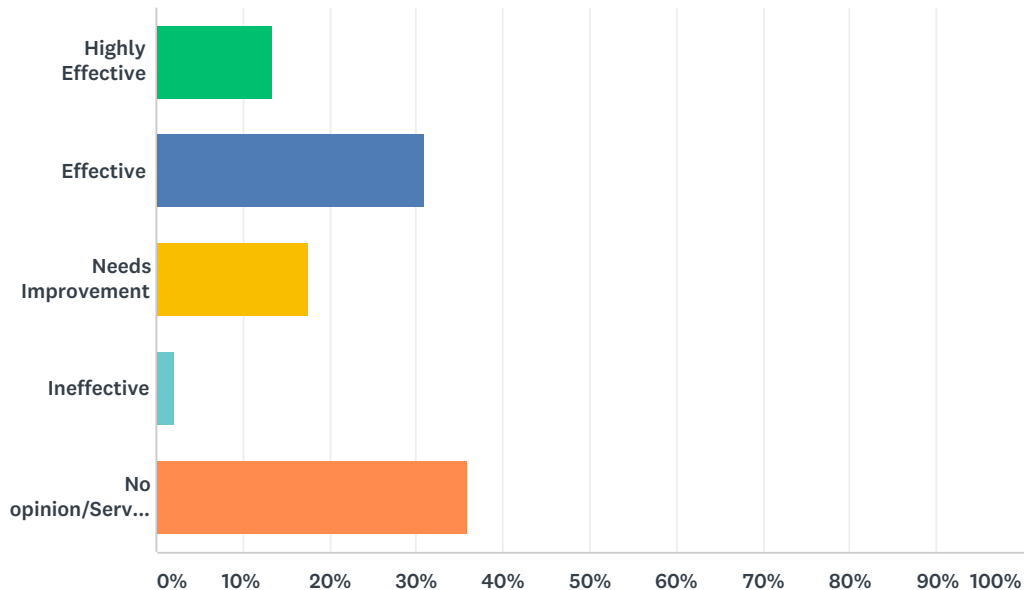

If necessary, grades 5/6 High Ability could stay in that building and grades 7/8 High ability could stay in that designated building. This would also allow the children to remain in contact with some of their social network and others in their grade level. This may reduce costs in terms of allowing the High Ability kids to participate in programming that already exists at Dennis and Test such as music, art, gym, etc. and not have to figure out how to provide these courses to the High Ability students at a separate building. 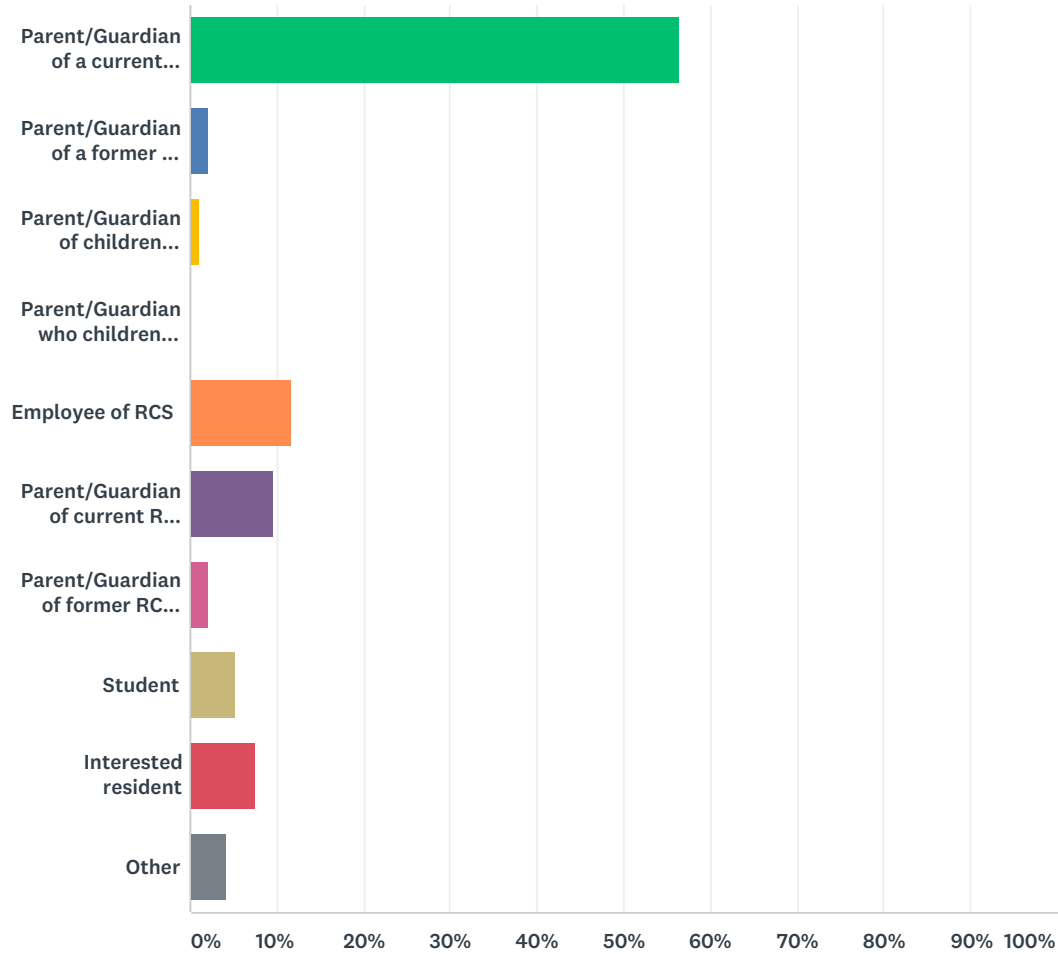

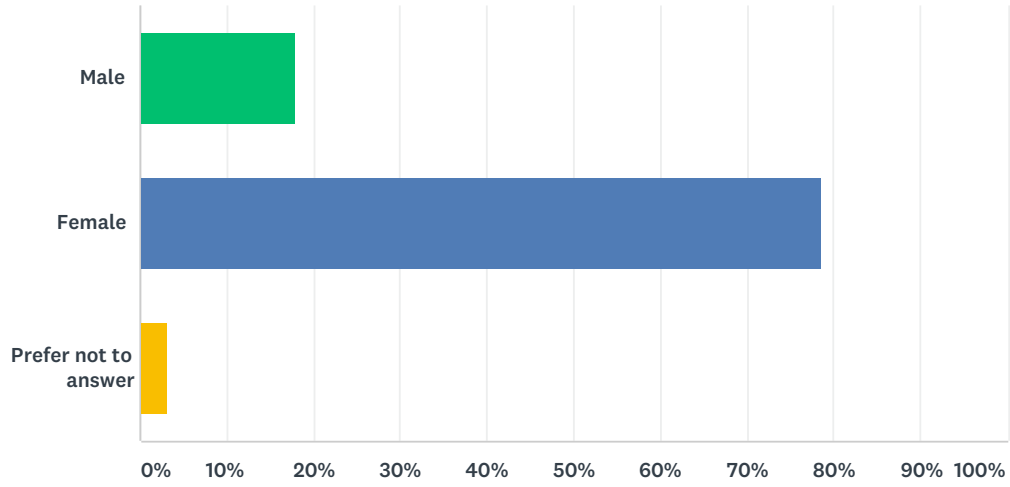

Q21 What is your gender?

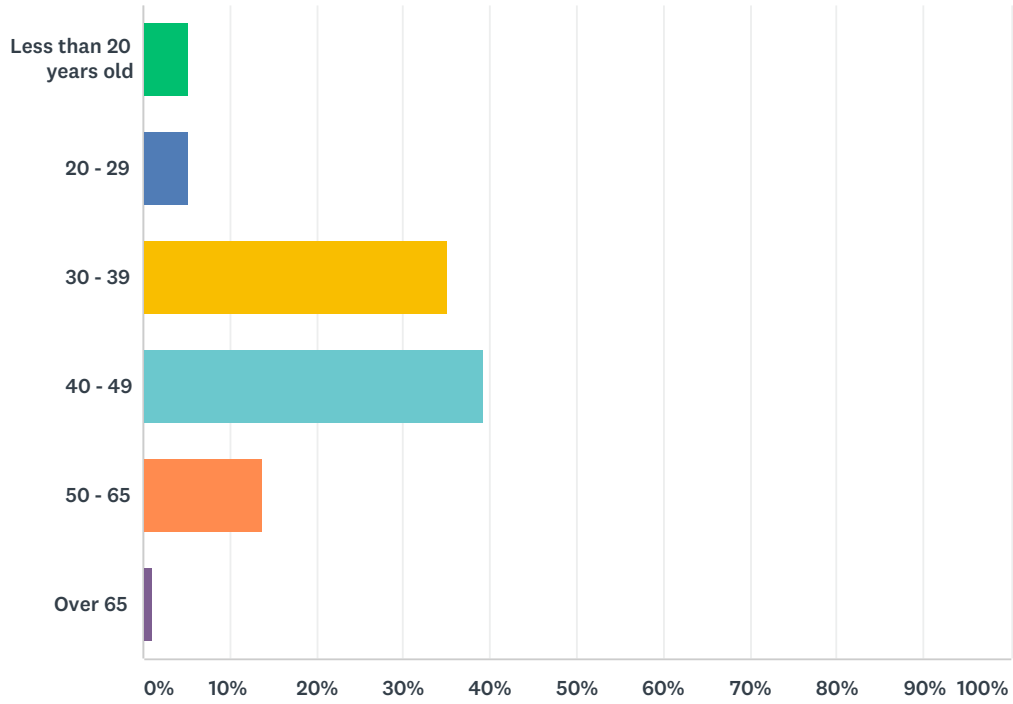

Q22 What is your age?

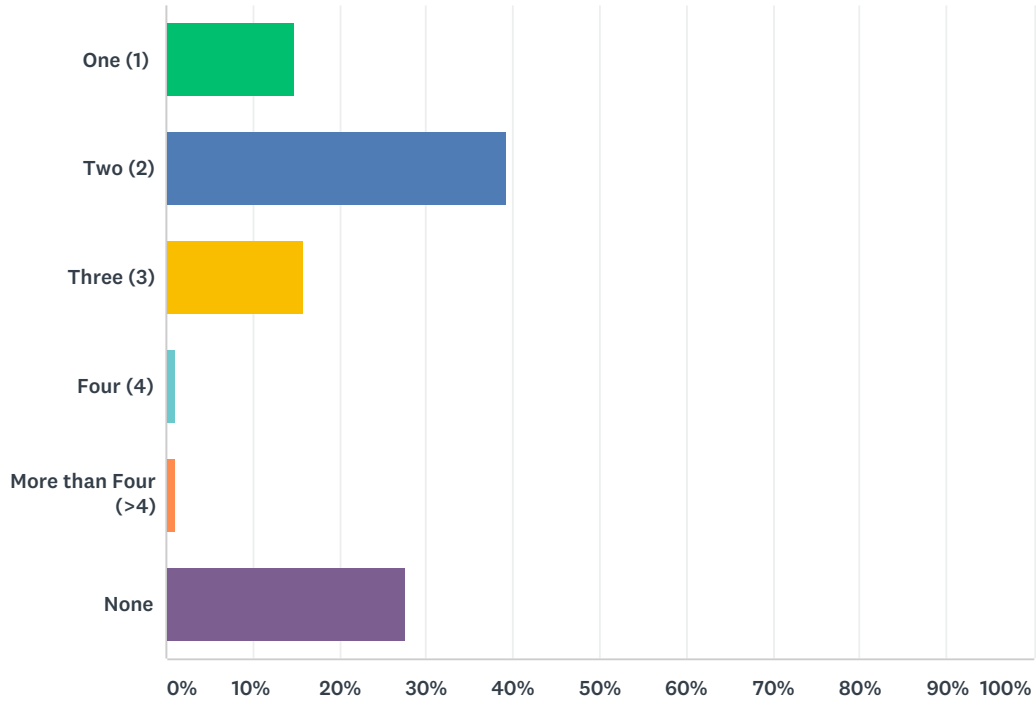

Q23 How many children ages 5 to 18 do you have?

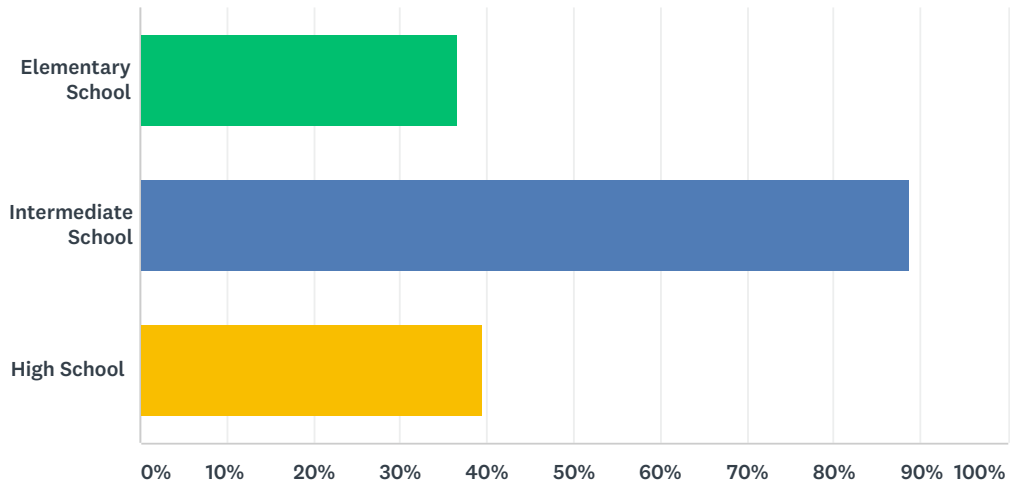
