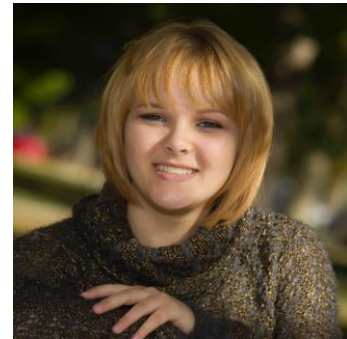

Richmond High School student receives Cox scholarship

(Richmond, Indiana) - The Cox Research Scholars Program has selected Madeline Mopps, a Richmond High School graduate, as one of its college scholarship winners.

The daughter of Stacy and Joyce Mopps, Madeline participated in Orchestra, Chamber Choir, Golf, Business Professionals of America and the National Honor Society. This fall, she plans to study business at Indiana University in Bloomington.



The Cox Research Scholarship is one of the most prestigious and competitive scholarships at Indiana University. The Cox Scholars Program is made possible by the generosity of IU alumnus Jesse H. Cox and his spouse, Beulah Chanley Cox, who specified that the scholarship include a rewarding work component such as a research experience. This scholarship is for outstanding incoming freshmen and offers Mopps a unique opportunity to work alongside distinguished faculty and to make important contributions to Indiana University's reputation as a top-tier research institution.

Mopps will be paired with a faculty mentor. Under her mentor's direction, she will be expected to work 8-10 hours a week on research and scholarly activities determined jointly by Mopps and her faculty mentor. She will be expected to present a written summary of her research accomplishments to her mentor and to the Cox Scholars Program at the end of each semester. The Cox Scholars Program also offers many exclusive academic and social programming opportunities on the IU Bloomington campus.
