



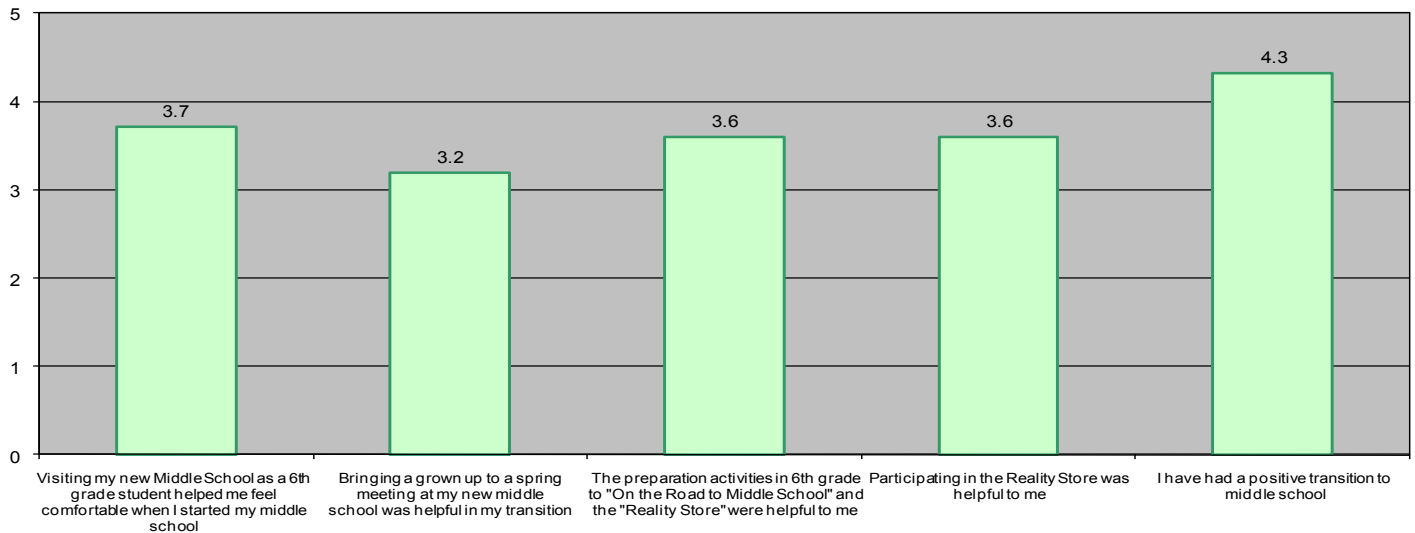

REPORTS/DISCUSSION TOPICS

Transitions Report: Garrison Elementary School Principal Kelly Andrews, Dennis Middle School Principal Kathy McCarty, Test Middle School Principal Luann Spicer, and Richmond High School Assistant Principal Rae Woolpy presented information on activities and strategies for assisting students in the transition from elementary to middle school and from middle school to high school. Below are the results of the Elementary to Middle School Transition Survey.

Summary of Elementary to Middle School Transition Survey



Athletic Report: Chad Bolser presented information regarding the 2009-2010 school year including programs, finances, communication, staff awards, and staff development.

Fixed Assets Annual Update: Bob Coddington stated that the 2010 Average Daily Membership (ADM) is 4972, an increase of 14.4 from 2009. Mr. Coddington reported that fixed assets have increased by \$3,462,499 or 1.7%.

PowerSchool: Pam Carr demonstrated how PowerSchool can be used by teachers and parents to gain information on student achievement and also how it is used to submit information for state reporting.

SNAPSHOTS OF SUCCESS

American Education Week: Adoption of the Proclamation in honor of American Education Week, November 14 to 20, 2010.

Immunizations: Dr. Bourff discussed the need for students to receive the immunizations that are required by the state. Students will be excluded beginning November 22, 2010 if they have not been immunized.

CONSENT ITEMS

Minutes: Approval of October 27, 2010 minutes.

Human Resources: Employment and Extra Duty Employment.

Supplemental Education Services Contract: Approval of the Supplemental Education Services Contracts from Abacus, ASCEND, Brain Hurricane and East Central. As a part of No Child Left Behind, schools at or beyond their first year in improvement status are required to offer supplemental education services (SES) to eligible students. For the 2010-2011 school year Crestdale and Fairview are required to offer these services.

Computer Leasing Agreement: The recommendation to approve the Computer Leasing Agreement for 450 Dell Optiplex teacher computers was tabled.
